# Writings from the Rev.

Dear members and friends of North Eaton Christian Church,

I want to begin with a big, "Hello!!!" I don't know about you, but this is an exciting time for me. What a great way to begin a new year and a new ministry.

For those of you who have just tuned in, I am Rev. Ralph S. Wearstler (*Rev. Ralph will do*) and I have been called by the congregation of North Eaton Christian Church to be their Intentional Interim Minister. My role and my ministry is to help this congregation during their "*In-Between Time*"—that gap of time between the retirement of your former Pastor, Paul Durbin, and the congregation's calling of a Settled Pastor.

Some of you have already asked, "How long is this 'In-Between Time'?" Well, since we are so early in the process, my response is, "God only knows." The thing is, there's much to be done in the weeks and months ahead. I am grateful that Pastor Paul did a good job of explaining the importance of this interim time.

What happens next is a process wherein you and I as a congregation will look at yourself. I come with a new set of eyes, seeing things that you may no longer notice, or seeing things from a different perspective. I also come with two mirrors so that you can see yourself, not only from the front, but also from the back.

This will be done in a number of ways. We will look at your long history as a congregation, and your personal relationship in that history. We will seek to gain a greater understanding of who North Eaton Christian Church is, your identity past, present and future. We will look at what you do in your ministry for Jesus Christ, and how that is seen by the community around you. We may even discover a new identity; a new sense of mission. (*I know that some of you have been working on this for a while; now, we will expand that to the whole congregation.*)

During this interim time, leadership will grow and it will also change. (As it has with the departure of your choir director and organist/pianist this last year.) Just know that this will be a time of encouragement,

empowerment and nurturing. We will also be looking at how leadership is shared among the congregation. (*How many hats do you wear? Maybe you don't wear any hats.*)

We will be looking at how this congregation is linked to the larger church, through the local community of churches, area and district church involvement, Ohio Regional work and mission, and support of the General levels of mission and ministry. (Actually, I can already see that this is one of your strengths.) All of these things will help this congregation to continue to move forward, becoming committed to beginning a new future.

I hope that you will see my time with you as an adventure, not just focused on the structural needs of this faith community, but also on the spiritual needs of each and every member, friend and seeker.

This cannot be accomplished by myself alone, or by a few hardy souls. It is the task and the responsibility of all of us working and sharing together, guided by the grace and wisdom of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

As we move into the Season of Lent, at the end of this month, let us use it as a time of reflection and renewal. Be mindful of Christ's gifts for you.

As it is stated in Ephesians 4:11-13: The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ.

I seek your prayers and support as we make this journey together.

This year, the annual Week of Compassion theme focuses on, "Where is your treasure?' which is taken from Matthew 6:21 when Jesus said, "...where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." February 15-22 has been designated as your time to share with people around the world who are in need. To give you some idea where your donations will go, listed below are a few regions that are part of our missions program:

In the Gulf Coast region of the United Sates, Disciples are volunteering at eight mission stations in response to the recent hurricanes. We also contribute to the Southwest Samaritan Ministries in its work with the poorest of the poor on both sides of the border in south Texas.

In Afghanistan, we are helping to rebuild peoples' lives and communities. Church World Service is teaching children the skills to help them overcome conflict. Week of Compassion is supporting educational programs in countries from Angola to Vietnam.

Three million people have been affected by violence in the Darfur region of Sudan. Week of Compassion is helping to make possible primary health care, water and sanitation programs, education, agricultural support, and much more. Indonesia, which was devastated by a tsunami, has been receiving help for four years, giving support and providing relief where needed.

In South America people in Argentina, Bolivia and Paraguay are being supported in their efforts to defend and promote their rights to own their ancestral lands and help with their economic, social and cultural rights. Week of Compassion is continually there to help whenever needed.
