

Writings From The Rev - May 2010

I am often amazed at the number of people unfamiliar with the Day of Pentecost. Even for faithful worship attenders the significance of Pentecost is foreign to them. It seems that the less formal a congregation's worship is, the less emphasis is placed on this Holy Day.

We celebrate Christmas with a lot of enthusiasm and preparation, intertwined with cultural and secular traditions. Easter calls us to a more spiritual preparation with times of prayer, Bible study, reflection, and self-sacrifice, so that we might have a greater and growing understanding of all that Jesus Christ has done for us.

But what's the big deal about Pentecost? Well, first, and foremost, it is the Birthday of the Church. While it is not a part of the Gospel story, Jesus does speak of this coming day.

In John 14:18-20, Jesus says, *"I will not leave you all alone. I will come back to you. In a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me. You will live because I live. On that day you will know that I am in my Father and that you are in me and that I am in you."* And then in verses 25-26, he goes on to say, *"I have told you this while I'm still with you. However, the helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything. He will remind you of everything that I have ever told you."*

In Luke's Gospel the very last words that Jesus speaks to his disciples are these, *"I'm sending you what my Father promised. Wait here in the city until you receive power from heaven."* (Luke 24:49). The full story of Pentecost is shared in Luke's history of the Early Church found in the Book of Acts, chapter 2. On that day the disciples did indeed receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. Yet, it wasn't only Jesus' closest disciples who received this gift, but all who turned to God and believed that Jesus was and is the way to Salvation. On that day the Church, the Body of Christ, was born. And what was true then is still true today, and every day, that everyone who proclaims Jesus as the Christ and is baptized is forgiven, receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit, and takes their place in the Body of Christ.

This is why we celebrate Pentecost, it is our birthday as the Body of Christ. As the Apostle Paul so clearly put it in I Corinthians 12:27, *"Now you are the Body of Christ, and individually members of it."* Each of us is a part of this body, but we are not all the same part, there are many parts. Some are new and some are old, some are strong and some are weaker. However, each one is gifted with a purpose and a responsibility to carry out the Mission and Ministry that began with Jesus. In fact, in verse 26, Paul says, *"If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it."*

This Body, the Church, is alive today because of those who shared in it, from past to present. And it continues to live and grow with each new generation of believers. Come join us on Sunday, May 23rd, as we celebrate Pentecost and rejoice in the baptism of new believers as they receive the gift of the Holy Spirit and take a fuller part in the ministry of our Lord Jesus Christ.

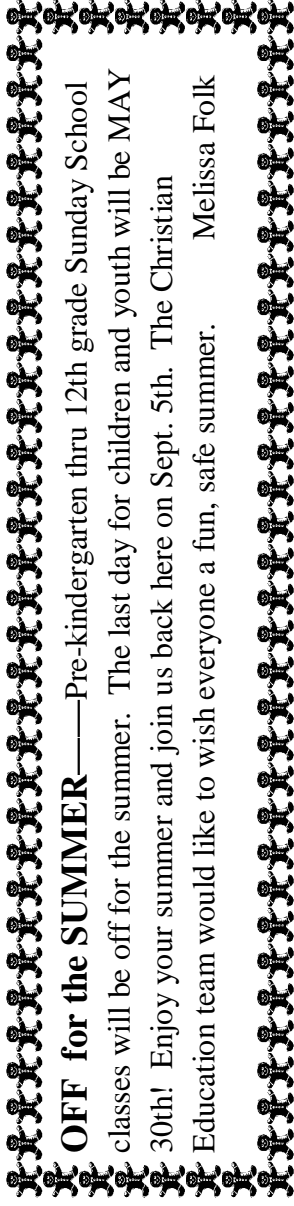
Summer Music Program

Resolving Disputes: The Rule of Christ

Recently, at our Camp Counselor Training event this, we talked about what was the best way to handle possible misunderstandings, conflicts, and bad behavior. One of the resources provided was a document called, "The Rule of Christ". It points out that when we find ourselves at odds with another person or perhaps just not understanding his or her position, the natural inclination for many of us is first to go to a third person (or group of people) and complain. This approach not only fails to resolve the problem, but frequently results in getting the third party entangled in a situation that is not his own. This is known as triangulation. A healthier response is for Christians to look to the insights provided by Jesus in Matthew 18: 15-17 and 20.

This model, "The Rule of Christ", walks us through a process of self-examination and dialogue with the person with whom we have an issue or concern. The basic steps are as follows:

1. **Pray:**

Honest reflection and true prayer might lead you to change your own behavior and your own way of thinking, and the issue will be resolved. *If the issue is not resolved, move on to the next step.*

2. **Approach the person by yourself** (Matthew 18:15):

For this step to be effective, you not only have to have an understanding of your own emotions, but you also have to be able to keep your feelings in check. You seek out the other person, not to yell at them but to work out the problem. Share your feelings and your perspective. Use "I" statements such as "I was hurt when..." or "I was angry when..." The person might not be aware of how deeply their words or actions have affected you. Invite the other person to share his/her perspective. This will help you understand that person better. Find a common solution that both of you can agree on. *If the issue is not resolved, move on to the next step.*

3. **Invite a Third Party to Help** (Matthew 18:16)

These people are brought in not to "gang up" on the person with whom you are having a problem, but to help the two of you see things from a new perspective and hopefully help you find a solution. Both you and the person with whom you are in conflict should trust these people. The people you bring in must be able to be objective and be capable of listening to both sides fairly. *If the issue is not resolved, move on to the next step.*

4. **Involve Church Resources** (Matthew 18:17a)

A church official or staff member either serves as a mediator for the issue or seeks a person trained in conflict mediation to solve the problem. This can be a long and involved process. *If the issue is not resolved, move on to the next step.*

5. **Move On** (Matthew 18:17b)

Some issues resist our best efforts at a resolution. We need to recognize the impasse and move on with our lives. The key is letting go of our negative feelings so that they do not continue to plague us.

6. **Trust God** (Matthew 18:20)

God will always be with us. This knowledge can help us as we move through the difficult seasons of our lives. If you find yourself in a situation where you are troubled with another person, begin by looking to Matthew 18 for guidance. If it is a matter related to North Eaton Christian Church, and you are still not sure where to start, you can speak to one of the staff members or church officers. General church concerns can be brought to Melissa Folk, Council Chairperson, one of our Elders, or Rev. Wearstler; church building or grounds concerns should go to Londa Blaine; Youth-related issues should be directed to Polly Tallos, Director of Christian Education and Youth; Worship issues should go to Diana Tyler or Lanson Wells. These staff members and church officers should be able to help you work through "The Rule of Christ" and direct you in the process of resolving your differences.
