Writings From The Rev - June 2010

Have you ever used the term "stirring the pot" in a conversation? It's an interesting phrase, when you stop to think about it. Unfortunately, in many cases, people who use it, use it as a negative, not a positive. "Man, you've really stirred the pot now!" Or, "Try not to stir the pot too much." It is often used to describe a deliberate provoking, or to excite strong feelings, in something or someone.

And yet, a more practical definition of this term means: To mix ingredients so that the heat is evenly dispensed. If you have ever made a stew or chili or soup, you know that if you don't stir the pot every so often, not everything will be cooked as it should. In fact, if you're not careful, things on the bottom will get burned and the whole meal could be ruined.

Well the pot is being stirred here at North Eaton Christian Church. It's not meant to provoke or excite in any negative way. The desire is to mix and evenly dispense.

Some may be thinking that this pot, known as North Eaton Christian Church, has been in the stirring process ever since the departure of Dr. Durbin and my arrival. That may very well be true. Others may have been thinking that this pot of church has just been simmering on the stove, and there's truth in that also.

However, with the Commissioning of your Search Team, a new and/or great stirring is now taking place. We are all in this process together. Questions are being asked of you, opinions, hopes, and dreams are being sought. If this stirring is provoking in anyway, its intent is to get you excited about the future of this congregation and how you will serve God, Christ, and the Church through the leading of the Holy Spirit.

One of the utensils for stirring (mixing) has been our Small Group Dinners, hopefully you have made the effort to be a part of one or more of them. Maybe you met someone you have seen around the church but really didn't know. Maybe you felt comfortable enough to share some of your impression and hopes for the mission and ministry provided by this congregation. However, looking at the sign up board, it seems that we need a bit more stirring in this pot. All it takes is someone willing to host and people making the effort to attend.

Another utensil is the Congregational Survey that has been handed out on Sunday morning for the past several weeks. It is also in this issue of The Voice, and is being sent out by e-mail. This survey is your opportunity to be an important part of the Search and Call process. The information gathered from you will greatly help the Search Team understand what the congregation, as a whole, wants and needs in seeking a candidate to be presented for your consideration. It will help in providing the best Church Profile (a picture of the Church) that is sent out to prospective candidates. Every person (young and old alike), member, worshiper, and friend has a responsibility to this process.

Your opinion does matter. So, fill out the survey and turn it in soon.

I pray that everyone of you will trust in the process, and even more so trust that God is at work in this process of bringing a new minister to you. God says in Isaiah 43:18-19a, "Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?"

NECC Youth: Paige Bokman, Tyler Bokman, Julie Haumschild, Jen Wilson, Kevin Wilson along with Polly Tallos and a male adult to be named later, will be participating in a Mission Trip to Bay City, MI. Much has changed since the Bay City region was settled more than 170 years ago...many elderly, widowed and disadvantaged residents are unable to make ends meet. Many local agencies struggle to support families through the hard winters and severe spring storms that have taken their toll.

Our group will partner with local churches, service agencies, and homeowners over the four days, to help bolster the efforts of the ongoing work in these communities. We'll learn new skills, serve in important roles, and have loads of fun as we: help people with projects in their home...assist the elderly...tutor struggling kids...conduct a backyard Bible club...serve at a food bank...staff an activities camp for disabled children... spruce up the grounds of a financially strapped social service agency...engage children at a day camp...and improve the community in many important ways.

The youth will be holding various fund raisers to help earn the money needed to take this trip to help others. The cost is \$199 per participant plus traveling costs; i.e. gas, dinner stops, and Walmart runs. The youth are responsible for the \$50 non-refundable registration fee and their incidentals.
