Anyone who has known me for any length of time will know how important Camp Christian has been in my life, my faith, and my ministry. I can easily say that Camp Christian is a major part of why I am in ministry today.

And when I say Camp Christian, I don't mean the place as a physical location, although it is beautiful. It is truly the people and the experiences associated with this place that have shaped and molded my understanding of the Christian Faith, my personal relationship with God, Christ, and Holy Spirit, and many of the values that define my character and who I am.

I have lost count of the number of times I have been to this very special place. It began with my first year at Chi Rho camp back in the summer of 1963, Camp Portage. And except for an error in judgment my freshmen year of high school, one which prevented me from attending my first year of Conference (a decision I still regret to this day), for the next 10 years I attended Wilmington Conference (3) and Advance Conference (7), even while serving in the Air Force. Then there was a five-year gap while being out of state in Indiana and Florida. From 1983 to the present, I have been a part of Hiram Conference. As you read this I will be attending Hiram Conference for the 28th year, serving as an Assistant Director for 26 of those years. That's a total of 40 years of Camp and Conference.


Yet, these were not the only times I came to Camp Christian. There were minister retreats, youth councils, counselor training, family camps, workdays, and overnight stays for other meetings in Columbus.

This place is where I first met my wife, Terri. She was on Camp Staff and I was just out of the Air Force, attending Hiram College in the Fall, and coming down for another year of Advance Conference. In fact, we spent part of our Honeymoon at Camp Christian. Our first month of marriage was Honeymoon, a week of Chi Rho and a week of Conference as Counselors, and then a week of Advance Conference when I served as Conference President.

All of my children attended the Camp and Conference programs. Emily served as a State Officer, Trevor was a Hiram Conference Officer, and Amber spent a whole summer of college filming and producing the current Camp and Conference Promotional Videos. As you can see, a good part of my life is connected to this awesome place.

But again, it's not the place, it's the people who have made this place what it is. It was people, counselors and other campers, who help me put the pieces of my faith together, helping me reach the point of making my confession of faith. It was people at this place who helped me begin to hear my call to ministry. It's this place where people are still helping me, encouraging me, and supporting me in my ministry. This place is where I have experienced the Spirit of God alive and working through many people, touching lives, touching me.

So, the next time someone asks you, or your children, or grandchildren to go down to Camp Christian, for whatever reason, make it a point to go. That's my prayer for you.



**Youth Mission Trip—“Week of Hope”
Bay City, Michigan July 25-30, 2010**

NECC Youth: Paige Bokman, Tyler Bokman, Julie Haumschild, Jen Wilson, Kevin Wilson along with Polly Tallos, Rev. Ralph and Pete Majewski (WACC) will be participating in a Mission Trip to Bay City, MI. Much has changed since the Bay City region was settled more than 170 years ago...many elderly, widowed and disadvantaged residents are unable to make ends meet. Many local agencies struggle to support families through the hard winters and severe spring storms that have taken their toll.

Our group will partner with local churches, service agencies, and homeowners over the four days, to help bolster the efforts of the ongoing work in these communities. We'll learn new skills, serve in important roles, and have loads of fun as we: help people with projects in their home...assist the elderly...tutor struggling kids...conduct a backyard Bible club...serve at a food bank...staff an activities camp for disabled children...spruce up the grounds of a financially strapped social service agency...engage children at a day camp...and improve the community in many important ways.

The youth will be holding various fund raisers to help earn the money needed to take this trip to help others. The cost is \$199 per participant plus traveling costs; i.e. gas, dinner stops, and Walmart runs. The youth are responsible for the \$50 non-refundable registration fee and their incidentals.
