THOUGHTS FOR THE JOURNEY-August 2013 Love – More!

You can never love too much. You can dote on someone or something too much, you can cuddle too much, stare at a picture too much, and even bake more cookies than are acceptable but you cannot *love* too much. Beloved, St. Paul emphasizes this to the church at Thessalonica in https://linear.com/11/20/20/. Paul writes, "Now about your love for one another we do not need to write to you, for you yourselves have been taught by God to love each other. And in fact, you do love all of God's family throughout Macedonia. Yet we urge you, brothers and sisters to do so more and more".

If there is anything that we should be excellent about, it is love. St. Paul made love practical when he wrote the memorable list in 1 Corinthians 13. Love is patient, love is kind. Love is not jealous. Love does not brag, and is not arrogant. Love does not act unbecomingly or seek its own. Love is not provoked. Love does not take into account a wrong suffered. Love does not rejoice in unrighteousness, but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things and endures all things. Love never fails.

St. Paul is saying, when it comes to showing love: you do some of that, but you can do a lot more of it. So excel still more or "do so more and more." The storyteller C. Roy Angel once illustrated the beauty of such self-abandoning love. Here is his story in his own words except for a slight modification. A college friend named Paul got a car as a present from his brother before Christmas. On Christmas Eve, Paul found a street urchin walking around his shiny new car, admiring it. "Is this your car, mister?" the boy asked. Paul nodded. "My brother gave it to me for Christmas." The boy look astounded. "You mean your brother gave it to you, and it didn't cost you nothing?" Boy, I wish . . ." Paul knew what he was going to wish. He was going to wish he had a brother like that. But instead, the boy said, "I wish I could be a brother like that." Paul was so impressed he offered the kid a ride in his car. The boy asked if they could drive in front of his house. Paul thought he wanted to show his neighbors his "sweet ride." But Paul was wrong again. They stopped in front of the boy's house, and he ran inside. He came out carrying his little polio-crippled brother. The older boy sat him down on the bottom step squeezed up against him, pointing to the car. "There it is," the older brother said. "His brother gave it to him for Christmas, and it didn't cost him a cent. Someday I'm going to give you one just like it, so you can see for yourself all the things in the Christmas windows I've been telling you about." Paul lifted the little boy into the front seat of his car. The older brother got in next to him, his eyes shining, and the three of them took a trip to see the Christmas windows. Paul learned that night what Jesus meant when he said, "There is more happiness in giving than in receiving."

Beloved, what would life be like if there were more of this kind of love demonstrated in the world? What would happen to others around us? What would be the difference in each of us? You can understand why the apostle Paul never tired of saying, "Keep on loving; do it even more!"


