#### "A Look That Kills"

Beloved, as believers, we are encouraged to "watch over our souls" diligently (Hebrews 10:39 and Hebrews 13:17). For every one who could be accused of being overly conscientious to the point of debilitation, there are hundreds who neglect self-examination. Lisa reminded us it was Friday the 13th, and that seemed to relieve the tension a little. I just closed my eyes and prayed to keep us all safe. After what seemed like an eternity, it ended and we were all okay. The crew on land looked like drowned creatures, but safe. Dillon and Kurt were at the campground soaked but safe. Everyone went to their campsites to check for damage. I told everyone there must have been family angels huddled with us.
